

## DNA Forum Interaction at EB

26 November 2018 Katowice, Poland

### Aim of the presentation

- The aim of the presentation is to:
  - give an overview of how the DNAs see the current situation of the CDM;
  - deliver suggestions to the Board on what work they could do to address the concerns/suggestions of the DNAs;
  - receive feedback from the Board.
- Inputs were received from DNAs who attended the Global DNA Forum Meeting 2018.

### Areas of concern

#### **DNAs expressed concern about:**

- the future of CDM after 2020 and under the Paris Agreement;
- the role of DNAs under the Paris Agreement;
- making the CDM more visible and relevant to national governments, possibly through linking it with nationally determined contributions and pre-2020 ambitions;
- the lack of demand for carbon credits / the need of nurturing such demand;
- the lack of instruments to ensure stability of carbon price;
- improving knowledge sharing, specially about technical matters and methodologies/standardized baselines, with the aid of regional collaboration centres;
- Eastern Europe, Middle East and Pacific islands are not well covered by the regional collaboration centres.



## Suggestions to the Board

#### The CDM-EB should:

- Promote the CDM Achievements report at highlevel events during the SB/COP;
- Consider translating the report in other languages (e.g. Spanish and French) to increase its reach;
- Prepare a separate document on sustainable development with more numbers/indicators to show how countries progressed on sustainable development;
- Continue simplifying methodologies and projects cycles, without compromising environmental integrity;
- Implementation an online platform for the EB and other DNAs to share knowledge and country experiences;
- Consider whether CDM could comprise forestry projects through REDD+ / some sort of cooperation;
- Continue technical support and DNA support through Global DNA Forum meeting, regional climate weeks and CDM events organized by regional collaboration centres, so that DNAs are updated on CDM rules and maintain their capacities and skills.
